

Double room at Campobello, Queen room Algonquin (There are also a few discounted rooms at Campobello with unusual amenities—such as 4th floor walk up or bathroom across the hall—ask Dawn)

In order to accommodate as many residents as possible in the Campobello rooms, 2 people in a double twin, queen or king room will be given priority over 1 person in a double twin, queen or king room.

The Library Committee meets on the first
Tuesday of the month (-/-) at 3:00p in the OV
Library. During meetings, residents are welcome
to come and share their concerns (or praises)
about the Library.

With the publication of David Allen Sibley's first bird identification book, bird lovers recognized a talented and unique voice. In What It's Like to Be a Bird, he reveals both a profound and tender understanding of our feathered friends. Adding to our collection of U.S. presidential administrations are Demon of Unrest in which Erik Larson describes the fraught period between Lincoln's election and the shelling of Fort Sumter. Doris Kearns Goodwin offers profiles of Lincoln, Theodore & Franklin Roosevelt, and Lyndon Johnson in *Leadership in our Turbulent Times*; Garry Wills writes about *Lincoln at Gettysburg*. In future, I wonder how the current administration will be described and by whom. Other Non-Fiction includes a hiking guide, Southern Maine Trails by Jill McMahon. Like Sibley, McMahon shows a personal love and affinity for her subject. There are colorful photographs and charming descriptions. Best of all, these trails are close to home and many are quite easy.

Turning now to **Fiction**, our classics this month are *The Good Earth* and *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. No need to name the authors! Two popular books you might like are

North Woods by Daniel Mason and Lady Tan's Circle of Women by Lisa See. By the book jacket, The Last One at the Wedding by Jason Rekulak sounds like a thriller. Beneficence by Meredith Hall has been compared to works by Marilynne Robinson and Kent Haraf. That cinched it for me! Many of you will be pleased to hear about a new LGPR: The Book of Longings by Sue Monk Kidd.

Added to **OVAuth** is Tom Troeger's *Song That Blesses Earth*. This is a collection of hymns, texts, carols and poems by a former resident. Not surprisingly, Tom's verses flow with wonderful rhythm and images. The committee takes a break from selection in July and August.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL REFLECTIONS

Nancy Wanderer, President
Susan and I moved to OceanView in 2012, not
knowing how wonderful it would be to live in a
community of deeply connected, caring people. We
were here for about two years before learning about
Community Council (which was then called "Resident

Council"). Initially, we thought the Council must be a small group of elected residents who made decisions about life on campus for the rest of us. When we finally got around to checking it out, we were delighted to realize that Community Council was a place to learn about everything going on at OceanView and to ask questions and

express our opinions about how to make this a better place to live.

In 2017, when I agreed to serve as Council president, I began by amending the Council by-laws, which were lengthy and legalistic. One of the amendments I suggested was changing the name to "Community Council" to reflect our vision of including the whole community, not just the residents, in our monthly meetings. The amendments also included term limits for officers and simplified operating procedures for the Council.

Now, eight years later, the current Council officers are proposing the following additional amendments to the by-laws: (1) adding a provision allowing the officers to call a special meeting if they deem it necessary, (2) allowing past officers to run for additional terms after a hiatus of one year, (3) allowing the Nominating Committee to nominate one of the current officers to serve for an extended term if all three officers' terms were set to expire at the same time, (4) making the Secretary responsible for distributing the Minutes to residents and archiving the Minutes and other official Council documents on the OceanView Portal, (5) increasing the dollar amount of

payments made by the Treasurer that require authorization from the Council or another officer, (6) providing that a copy of the current by-laws, as well as the proposed amendments, be provided to residents at least 14 days (rather than 30 days) before the meeting at which the amendments will be voted upon, and (7) providing that approval of an amendment will require a majority affirmative vote (rather than a two-thirds majority.)

As required by the by-laws, I am providing a copy of the by-laws as amended in 2017 and a copy of the by-laws containing the changes we are proposing in 2025. If you have any questions, please contact me at wanders8899@gmail.com.




